#### **Monday Evening**

The Monday class started the year with a huge turnout at the open house: more than 16 couples if I remember correctly. We've since settled to between one and two dozen dancers each week, with a good ratio of experienced to completely new. We're confused enough to get a good laugh but not so much that it becomes a struggle.

We've learned the basic steps: skip change, strathspey travel, strathspey setting step, and pas de basque. We also know a few figures by name, like "corners pass and turn", and we've learned a mirror reel of three and a crossover reel of three. Remembering an entire dance is still a challenge, but we beginners can always trust our experienced partners to remind us where to go.

We're having so much fun that Monday is now my favourite day of the week. See you there!

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#### Thursday Afternoon

We've had a good month, some lovely weather. It was good to welcome Claire back, after some covid isolation (husband Jim, not Claire herself) and travel to visit family farther west. Speaking of covid and such, we do appreciate it when someone not feeling well lets us know, and misses class.

Also this month we welcomed a new member, Janet. She has prior experience with other forms of formation dancing, and is a quick study. Having a new member has been good for all of us, we have been paying more attention to things we often take for granted, such as the transitions between skip change and pas de basque, and the way progression works in a set.

Reviewing dances from the upcoming social programme has provided opportunity to look closely at things such as mirror reels of three, then crossover reels (the Kissing Bridge); corners (Triple Happiness); and reel of four (The Lairds' Chain).

We try to finish with something relatively easy and familiar. At that point, Doug often pipes up with The Wild Geese, a witty reference to the fact that the dance was done several times earlier in the term. Will it reappear? Stay tuned.

#### From the Library ...

The library has a number of books with information on Scottish country dancing that can be borrowed. Could you use a little help with your dancing? A useful book we added in 2022 is Step We Gaily, A Scottish Country Dancing Manual. The introduction says the book is a manual for dancers and teachers covering the basic steps in Scottish Country dancing. It provides specific foot positions for basic steps and outlines modifications to the basic steps when danced in specific formations. It discusses more complex footwork such as changing feet while doing the strathspey. It also discusses the importance of the rhythm of the music in dancing. You can review the steps at your own pace. This book will be as helpful to experienced dancers as well as new ones.
