
# The Winnipeg Spring Workshop!

The maple leaf tartan became an official national symbol in 2011 and highlights the many contributions that people of Scottish heritage have made to the founding of Canada. Canada is the only country in the world with a maple leaf on its flag. The maple leaf tartan was designated in 1964 to commemorate the new Canadian flag.
