End of an Era - The Flying Scotsman

The Royal Train will soon leave the station for the last time.

The **Flying Scotsman** train is nearing the end of its lifespan and will be decommissioned before 2027. The train, a suite of nine railcars that can be hitched to a locomotive, originated in 1869 when Queen Victoria commissioned a pair of railcars to accommodate her travels. Alas, modern operational costs and upgrades required for the more advanced rail systems exceed resource availability.

Classes will be back in September, on both Monday evening and Thursday afternoon.


