Recently while I was away on vacation to visit a friend in Nanaimo I was able to add a few extra days to do some country dancing out in Victoria, B.C.

The trip started with the 3-day English country dance workshop, Hands Across the Water, put on annually by the Victoria English Country Dance Society from September 5th to 7th.

While still visiting Victoria I was also able to attend the open house for the Vancouver Island Scottish Country Dance Society on September 9th.

Turnout exceeded expectations for them. Within a room a bit smaller than ours, they didn't think there would be any issues with available space, but we filled the place with approximately 75 attendees. Music was provided by their group band.

The dances were done in tight spaces with either 2 circles or 3 longways lines going at all times. The night started with Beacon Hill circle, a mixer done to the tune of the Teddy Bears Picnic, followed by Hospitality Circle. The rest of the night included some basic step instruction and a number of 4 couple longways set reels, jigs, and a strathspey.

They usually hope to get out up to 8 new members a year joining following the open house, and have multiple weekly classes separated by level of skill and knowledge with each class having somewhere around 18 to 25 people in it.

A good time was had by all.
