A Word from the Chair of COM

Recently, as I was driving near Assiniboine Park, in the distance I could hear the welcome music (at least welcome to me!) of a pipe band. In those days before covid, the sound of a pipe band was delightful and entertaining, but in these days it seems to me that their music takes on a greater significance. Hearing the pipes and drums playing in the park was a sign to me that we are drawing closer to that time when restrictions will come to an end, and our daily life will not be focussed on masks and double vaccinations and case counts. A time when a pipe band playing in a park is not unusual, just good music!

Many of our former routines and practices are coming back to us. Restaurants are open, as are movie theatres and sports events. Your Committee of Management is as eager as you are for us to be back dancing, and to that end we are in consultation with St Paul's Anglican Church regarding future hall rental. We are not yet at the point of resuming classes and it is important that, for the sake of everyone's safety, we do not rush into indoor dancing without the appropriate protocols and plans. And of course it is equally important that when we do resume dancing, each of us, for the safety of all of us, are double vaccinated, with perhaps a booster shot if indicated.

Though we can't yet begin indoor dancing, we can gather together. The first event your COM has planned is a Garden Party on Sunday afternoon, 12th September in the yard of St Paul's Anglican Church. Beginning at 2:00 p.m., this is an informal gathering, solely with the intent of reconnecting with one another after a long time of separation. We invite you to bring your own lawn chair and come visit with your friends. If weather prohibits our gathering, we have set the following Sunday as an alternate date. I hope you will join us.

I know all of us long for the time when we can ask another dancer "would you like to dance?" Until then, let's make opportunities to keep in touch with one another and look forward to our return to the dance floor.

In the area on the North Drive part of St Paul's Church there is a Rowan Tree that was planted in memory of David Stevenson.

David joined the Branch in 1985. I was the Basic Class teacher, and apparently excited to have a physically fit young man in the class.


David became involved in all the Branch functions, and often brought his brother and mother out to the "special events". He attended all the Workshops, joined the Demonstration class. was on the Committee of Management, always supportive and always a smile. His favorite out of town Workshop was in Saskatchewan.

He will be remembered for:

- bringing cowboy boots for the cowboy song segment at Workshop Ceilidh.
- every year he took a different route to the Qu'Appelle Valley workshop, but never found the correct one.
- winning the most prizes at the silent auctions.
- his party piece: an accountant's version of The Shooting of Dan McGrew.

David was diagnosed with a lymphoma, and after an extended hospitalization passed away on August 30, 2005 at the age of 51.

Every Spring I visit David's Tree to see how it's growing. Reg Curle is our local arborist and tends to the tree. I go there often, for a quiet time of reflection, as do others.



That area is now St. Paul's memorial garden. But it started with David.
