### From the Chair....

In light of this, we will be needing an Assistant Social Convenor and an Assistant to the Editor of the Light and Airy. The past few weeks have been anything but "lazy", as the Branch has been involved in many events and preparing for those ahead. One of the past events included three nights of dancing. The events planned have and are taking place, having started on August 31<sup>st</sup> at the Barge Festival at the Forks. On Sunday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>, the annual Selkirk Settlers' parade was held. The Branch participation in this was organized by Wendy Land and Joyce Cormack, and our thanks go to them and to all the Branch members who participated. As part of that same day's events, tying in with the Barge Fest, which had a Scottish theme this year, the Demonstration team, wearing their "Selkirk Settlers" costumes, performed on stage at the Dock at the Forks, later in the afternoon.

On Friday evening, September 7<sup>th</sup>, as part of the Branch's contribution to these Bicentennial Celebrations, the Demonstration Class, with other Branch members and a couple of guest artists, presented a Pageant, followed by a Ceilidh. The Pageant depicted the journey of the first Selkirk Settlers, through narrative, music, song and dance. It was held at Lower Fort Garry, and we were honoured by the attendance of the present-day Lord Selkirk, the Right Honourable James Douglas-Hamilton, Baron Selkirk of Douglas, P.C., Q.C., who is a descendant of the 5<sup>th</sup> Lord Selkirk, who founded the Selkirk Settlement here in Manitoba. Many Branch members and our musicians worked hard in preparation for this event. Our grateful thanks are extended to them all.

We are also getting ready and excited for the start of our new season of dancing, which opened with our annual "Welcome Dance" on Friday, September 14. We hope many of you were able to attend, to welcome fellow members back after the summer break, as well as prospective new members.

"Ceud Mille Failte", in the Spirit of the Dance, to our new season and upcoming 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Winnipeg Branch.

## Timespan Project

Jacquie Aitken, from the Timespan Museum and Arts Centre in Helmsdale, Scotland, has been in Winnipeg since August 30 for the Bicentennial celebrations. She will be in Manitoba until September 21, spending a week of that time in Churchill, where many of the Selkirk Settlers landed.

While in Manitoba, Jacquie will be promoting the Trans-Atlantic "Sock Sampler" project and the new app "Museum Without Walls: Scotland's Clearances Trail App". The Sock Sampler is a cultural exchange project in which the people from East Sutherland will share knitting, patterns, songs, dances, stories and recipes with people from Manitoba. The cultural exchange will be documented and exhibited in the Timespan centre in the summer of 2013 and tour Canada in 2014.

The Clearances Trail app will allow visitors to access stories, pictures and videos on their smart phones while they follow a 19-24 km trail of important sites from the Highland Clearances. Next year, Timespan will be commemorating the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the emigration from the Strath of Kildonan to the Red River area in 1813.
