#### Who is JT?

It is John Trevenen!

John, or John T, as we affectionately called him, was introduced to Scottish Country Dancing in the early 1960's through his friendship with David Williams, co-founder of the Winnipeg Branch. John's love of dancing took him to many places including several trips to St. Andrews' summer school in Scotland.

After his marriage to Betty in 1974, John's dancing focused on Winnipeg. In wanting to share his love of both music and dance, he went on to obtain his Teacher's Certificate at Summer School in 1976 at Kingston.

John was always expanding his interest and knowledge of dance and was co-founder, with David, of the Village Green English Country Dancers and the Village Green Morris Men. he was widely recognized for his expertise in dance and taught at many workshops in North America.

John's contribution to the Branch was immeasurable, as a teacher, committee member, and dancer. Being a proponent of "live music" he was constantly on the look-out for up and coming musicians who could be converted to the Scottish tradition. He loved to sing and was an active member of Bunch of Grapes.

John was an English teacher and loved words. He was accepting of everyone, generous and supportive in his teaching, and kind in his critique. He was a dreamer of greater things and had been planning ways to bring his two groups –English and Scottish-together.

John died in September 1996 at the age of 57. He had been out doing one of his favourite things: dancing with the Morris Men.
