Scotland's Most Popular Painting

On a spring Wednesday the Winnipeg Art Gallery had an Art for Lunch program on a painting voted Scotland's most popular painting. Christ of the Cross of St. John. It was painted by Dali in 1951 and was purchased for f8,200 which also included the copyright. The purchase was controversial. It was made despite petition against the purchase arguing that the money should be spent on exhibition space for local artists was submitted.. It went on display in Glasgow's Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum in 1952. It won a poll to decide Scotland's favourite painting in 2006 with 29% of the votes. Since it included the copyright it has earned Glasgow Museums back the original cost many times. The Spanish government is said to have offered f80 million pounds for the painting which was turned down

Not long after the Winnipeg Art Gallery program a copy of the painting was on display in the window of a Winnipeg second hand store which was up for auction. With encouragement from a few friends who said the opportunity to buy it would never come up again I put in a winning bid. It will be on display with other Scottish memorabilia at the St. Andrew's social.

the day". Note the speed of the music!
