The Committee of Management voted to advise our voting member to vote in favour of this motion. The committee felt that the Management Board would not have been asking for this change unless it was necessary and that it was important to support headquarters. October is a month devoted to highlighting the importance of physical activity in the lives of everyone but especially senior citizens.

There are various events going on across Winnipeg throughout the month and some of our dancers have volunteered to participate in two Health Fairs. The first one is October 10 at Kildonan Place Shopping Center at 1PM close to the food court. We will be doing a few simple dances to show the public what we do and how much fun we have. We will also be doing some participation dancing so that the public can give it a try. Class Reports

Technique Class (Tuesdays):

Joyce Cormack, our class teacher, has been spending the first few weeks attempting to get class members back up to speed after a summer away from regular classes. Dancing at summer festivals and public events is great fun but not the same as technique classes. Amazing how the feet and brain seem to be somewhat disconnected the first few evenings in September. Attendance has been sporadic the first two weeks with many of us still in the travel mode and closing up cottages. Joyce plans to work on some dances that are very challenging and interesting but not so well known. We recently worked on a dance called "Quarries Jig" which has a twelve bar phrase where the dancing couple turns their corner into the centre and corners become the active couple. After a few failed attempts we mastered the tricky bits and put the dance together. Not being a teacher I have a difficult time explaining the formation but now have a greater appreciation of the skill in devising such a dance. Set and link for three couples was one of the formations in a strathspev called "Gang the Same Gate"; a nice twist on the usual set and link for two couples. For those non Manitobans who read our newsletter please note that at the time of writing there is no frost on our pumpkins.

Basics of Scottish Country Dancing Class (Thursdays):

Circle round & back, RH across, LH back, turn by the right, turn by the left, lead down the middle and back, cast down and cast back up, figure of 8, pas de basque, allemande pant, pant, pant. This is what the basic class has learned in the short time since the class started. They have learned all of that in quick time and as of last night, most of that in Strathspey. They are such a fun, keen group that they just keep soaking up what Cheryl (and Maureen when she subs) throws at them. It is great place to be on Thursday nights. There is much laughter and as a branch member, I enjoy watching them as they learn and to see their faces when they get through a new dance. It's been great too to see some regular members come out to make up sets and give support to the new dancers. I'm hoping that they will come out to the Social in November to meet other members and try out their new skills.

Bannockburn Live: A feast of food, music and history

700 years after Scotland's most famous battle, experience the biggest ever reenactment of the Battle of Bannockburn at Bannockburn Live.

The National Trust for Scotland's three day spectacular takes place on **Saturday 28**, **Sunday 29 and Monday 30 June 2014** and, as well as a brutally realistic re-enactment of the battle, features an array of themed villages, where visitors
