Branch News

Adam M Laird, 1918 – 2015

By the time you are reading the newsletter, probably you know that Adam died on Wednesday 27 May. A memorial celebration will take place at Charleswood United Church, 4820 Roblin Blvd, on Wednesday 17 June, starting at 11 AM.

He was first a dancer, later the first musical director of Scotch Measure, and was pianist with the band for several years, including the recording of the first Scotch Measure CD, Skip Change With Scotch Measure. He was also a

composer, and his tunes can be heard on both the CDs, including sensitive arrangements by Ken Nattrass on the second CD, Prairie Gold.

If you have the CDs, get them out and play them. If you have any sheet music of Adam's tunes, get those out, too. It is a wonderful legacy to Scottish traditional music, and to Scottish Country Dancing in particular. His contribution was recognized by a life membership in the Branch.

He was a gentleman in the best sense of the word – gentle man – and he is missed. Our thoughts are with Rena and the family.

CHRISTINE M. WALLACE

May 10, 1939 - March 8, 2015

Christine was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, the eldest child of a Scottish surgeon and a Canadian nurse. Scottish Country Dance was a part of home life, as Christine's father would bring medical students home to teach them dancing, as well as medicine.

Christine came to Canada to pursue her chosen field of early childhood education. In Winnipeg, she found a fledgling group of Scottish Country Dancers being taught by David Williams and Archie Nixon. This group would become the Winnipeg Branch on May 11, 1963.

Christine went on to obtain her Teachers Certificate in 1965. She was an almost 50 year member of the Teachers' Association of Canada. She taught all levels of classes and groups in the Branch, including some Teacher Candidate classes. However, her favourite was always a childrens' class.

Recently, Christine was teaching the Demonstration Class. One of the more significant events was the planning and production of a pageant in celebration of the 200th anniversary of the arrival of the Selkirk Settlers in Manitoba.

Along with teaching, Christine was very involved with Branch development and had been chairman on many occasions. She participated in the formation of the band Scotch Measure. Christine played a leading role in the preparation for the Branch's 50th Anniversary in 2013. One of the enduring results is the Winnipeg Branch book of locally devised dances, Prairie Gold, with the accompanying CD by Scotch Measure.

Christine was our resource person for tradition, protocol, history, and whatever one needed to know about the Royal Scottish Country Dance Society. She was also an avid Monarchist. One of the treasures Christine brought to Canada with her was the piece of cake from Princess Elizabeth and Prince Phillip's wedding.

Christine was awarded the Winnipeg Branch Life Membership in 1990, and the RSCDS Scroll of Honour in 2010.

Christine's death is so tragic in so many ways. A few years ago she was taken to hospital, and told she probably wouldn't walk again. When asked if she had plans, she replied that, indeed, she did. Her plan and goal was to dance again. And, she almost did.
